- For successful counselor training of around 200 people for the upcoming JOY@Kempton Park, and the 15-20 churches involved in this groundbreaking event.
- In the UK office, the hard work of internal 'housekeeping' from earlier this year is now paying off, and the team can now more fully focus on building for the future.
- For this exciting report from U.K. Director Dave Plowman:

"Last night Max and I led our first RE:NEW worship and prayer night. We ran it at St. Saviours in Sunbury at the church that is leading the outreach at Kempton Park with us. We are organizing the stage program and Andrew Palau is speaking at it.

Worship was led by 'All the Kings Pieces' a great worship group from Wales. It was such a powerful time!

The focus of the evening was to unite the church, equip the individuals, and send them out to reach their friends for Jesus inviting them to the festival in Kempton. There was a great range of churches and over 200 people came out to be part of the worship and prayer. (For the UK its very rare that you would get over 100 people out for a worship night.)

It was an intimate and precious evening, many engaged right from the start as we encouraged them remember what it was like when they first fell in love with Jesus.

We prayed for people's hearts and handed our fears, worries, and barriers over to Him. Throughout the evening, the crowd sung worship to God and prayed in groups for Kempton park and all who are involved in it. We listened to God and many responded to the call to receive healing and freedom through the Holy Spirit. We had the privilege to pray for individuals at the side of the platform and a number of backs were healed. Hearing was restored and legs were fixed. Many encountered Jesus again that night.

There are now four weeks to go until Kempton Park, and while we do not know how many people will come, our prayer is that through the kingdom-minded event, many will give their lives to Jesus upon hearing the Good News. Praise Jesus for how this event is coming together. We have a great program lined up. We will hopefully feed over 5,000 people, restore two family homes and run a family-friendly festival sharing the Good News. God has led the way and guided every step.

Pray with us:

- For upcoming June 15-17 is JOY@Kempton Park, a weekend long event culminating Sunday with the feeding of the 5000, featuring Andrew Palau, a number of popular music groups, and a free lunch for all. There is a great sense of excitement and enthusiasm for this event, and as it is the first of its kind in the UK, no one knows quite what to expect.
- For all the local churches (15-20 of different denominations) involved in Joy@Kempton as they all work together on the final logistics for the event, and all final preparations.
- For those inviting their neighbors, family and friends to the event, that they would be bold in their outreach, and that those invited would respond positively and attend.
- For the people who will attend that they will be ready to respond to the Gospel.
- For Andrew during the June trip to the UK, when he will be meeting with significant city/national leaders, for strength and depth in these Kingdom relationships.

- For several key cities in the UK, that plans would come together for future events to be held. Talks are underway, and many key leaders and churches are expressing interest.
- For relationships to solidify and for direction as to the best opportunities to share the Gospel.
- For the possibilities of outreach to Berlin in a CityFest, especially in light of the 30th anniversary of the fall of the Berlin wall. Pray for church leaders to come together for a city impacting event.
- For the October Palau Tour, an intensive week of ministry in the UK, including Andrew, Wendy and Kevin Palau, as well as musical guests, and many different events.
- For several internal changes coming up, for wisdom and discernment for planning the most effectively for the next few years.
